Safety - Everyone must comply with all Park rules and with instructions of the ASRP Manager and staff. Firearms may not be brought to the firing line until the match director has called the line hot. All firearms, cased or not, must be carried straight up between the line and your vehicle.

Dates - February 1, March 1, April 5, May 3, June 7, Aug 2, Sept 6, Oct. 4, Nov 1, Dec. 6, 2025

Location - Albuquerque Shooting Range Park, (505-836-8785) Take exit 149 from I-40, go north about 4 miles to turnoff to ASRP, follow pavement west until you reach the range.

Time - Registration begins at 0900. Firing starts at ~0930.

Registration Procedure - First, pick up a target frame. Come to the 100 yard range immediately east of the range house for the match. Please sign in on the match/league signup sheets. The match director will collect fee. Firing will begin when all competitors are signed in and ready to fire. If you have your own portable frames please bring them!

Fee - Match fee (includes Alb Shooting Park fee) is \$8 for Sandia members, \$10 for non-Sandia members, and free to juniors and collegiates. There is no league fee.

Insurance – SGC members are covered by the Club's insurance. Non-members pay an additional two dollar (\$2.00) per match fee to register as a SGC "match member."

Rules - Current NRA Conventional Smallbore Prone rifle rules will apply (league is not NRA approved). Additionally, an F-Class or Unlimited Rifle category has been created, though scores fired by shooters in this unsanctioned category will not be turned in to the NRA, and they will not compete directly with shooters using complying equipment. Any safe .22 caliber rimfire rifle may enter the F-Class category. Telescopic sights may be used for all stages, and rests and sandbags will be allowed. Please contact the match director if you have questions.

Course of fire - Match will be conducted at 50 and 100 yards. Match is one-hundred twenty (120) shots for record. Time is 20 minutes per target card (20 shots), including unlimited sighters during that period.
Stage 1 - 40 record shots, 50yds, iron sights (50 meters reduced, target A51)
Stage 2 - 40 record shots, 100yds, iron sights (100 meters, target A-33)
Stage 3 - 20 record shots, 100yds, any sights + 20 record shots, 50yds, any sights (Dewar) (50 meters reduced, target A51, 100 meters, target A-33)

Awards – No awards will be given.

Targets and Frames - The league will provide a target frame and targets (A-51 and A-33). Participants may provide any special frames they require.

ANY SIGHTS (sun): Match 6: Dewar course (20 shots, 50 yds, target A23; 20 shots 100 yds, target A-25); Match 7: 100 yds, 40 shots, target A-25); Match 8: 50 meters, 40 shots, target A-26), Match 9: 50 yds, 40 shots, target A-23/5; 1600 aggregate Match 10

Iron sights, any rifle Saturday; any sights, any rifle Sunday. State champion will be from the aggregate of both days matches MATCH 11

Anyone may elect to shoot scope both days. On Saturday, they will compete in a Scope any sight class and on Sunday they will be placed in their respective class. Competitors who choose scope only will not be eligible for State Champion.

F-CLASS SHOOTERS: There is an F-Class division. Current NRA F-Class rules will apply in regards to equipment. There will be no classes, categories or division of rifle. F-Class shooters will use NRA metric targets (A-51 (reduced for 50 yards), A-50 (50 Meters) and A-33 (100 yards). F-Class will have its own award pool. F-Class Smallbore is now recognized by the NRA. Competitors who choose F-Class only will not be eligible for State Championship.

NRA classification will be used (rule 19.15). Competitors will be grouped by age: novice (10 or younger), subjunior (11-14), inter. junior (14-17), junior (18-20), and adult (over 21). Less than 3 competitors will be combined.

The Mini Palma course of fire includes 15 Shots each at 100 Yards on the A37 (match 1), A38 (match 2), & A39 (match 3), or F37 (match 1), F38 (match 2), and F39 (match 3). Aggregate Mini Palma is Match 4. The English Match course of fire will include 60 shots prone (English Match) for both sling and F-CLASS (matches 5, 6, 7). Targets are A-51 fired at 50 meters. Iron sight aggregate (2400) Match 18. Any sight aggregate (2400) Match 20. Grand aggregate Match 21 (4800).

Anyone of any age, may elect to shoot scope all 4 days. Scope Class will have its own award pool. Competitors who choose Scope Class only will not be eligible for the Regional Championship.

F-CLASS SHOOTERS: Current NRA F-Class rules will apply in regards to equipment. There will be no classes, categories or division of rifle, unless there are 6 competitors in that class. F-Class shooters will use NRA metric targets (A-51 (reduced for 50 yards) and A-33 (100 yards). F-Class will have its own award pool. F-Class Smallbore is now recognized by the NRA. Competitors who choose F-Class only will be eligible for the F Class Regional Championship.

NRA classification will be used (rule 19.15). Less than 3 competitors in a class will be moved to the next higher class. A High Master class will be used which consists of all supported shooters, distinguished prone rifle shooters, or any shooter who has fired five or more 1200s or 1600s. Please indicate if Hi Master when entering.

CHALLENGES: Rule 16.1 It cost \$2.00 to challenge your score, or another competitor's score. The challenge period for the last match of the day will end at 9am on the following day (Fri, Sat) and 8 am on Sunday. Challenges on Saturday will end 30 minutes after the final scores are posted.

Awards: Cash or merchandise prizes in individual matches. Regional medals for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd. The below listed vendors have provided merchandise, which will be awarded as door prizes daily and to the winners in all aggregates. There will be a prize table for the 4800 aggregate on Saturday afternoon after the match in the cafeteria. Winners must be present
